The University of Graz is a public HEI with a strong international profile offering more than 100 BA, MA and PhD degrees. Located in the city of Graz – Europe's cultural capital 2003 – it is home and an exciting and inspiring environment for 30.300 students (11,6 % international), 2.600 academic and 1.200 administrative staff. An institution with a strong international profile it concentrates on the core activities of research and education at 6 faculties (Arts & Humanities, Law, Social and Economic Sciences, Theology, Natural Sciences and Environmental and Regional Sciences and Education). #### Documents to be uploaded

The following documents must be uploaded to the AL IDRISI online application system by the application deadline of the respective AL IDRISI call. Note that students applying for doctoral exchange/degree must be able to provide the complete bachelor and master documentation by the deadline of the respective AL IDRISI call.

#### EXCHANGE mobility:

- <u>Proof of enrolment</u> in an equivalent/similar program and at the same level the AL IDRISI application is for at the home university signed and stamped by the admissions office / registrar of the home university
- <u>Diplomas of ALL previously completed university degrees</u>, for **PhD/doctorate application** undergraduate/bachelor and master diplomas.
- <u>Transcripts of records of ALL previously completed and current degrees</u>, for undergraduate/bachelor application – undergraduate/bachelor transcript; for PhD/doctorate application – undergraduate/bachelor, master and PhD transcript.
- <u>Learning Agreement</u> containing the intended courses (course nr, course title, ECTS of Uni Graz courses MUST be included) at the University of Graz (undergraduate/bachelor and master ONLY)
- <u>Research Plan</u> (PhD/doctorate, post-doc and staff ONLY)
- <u>Titles of bachelor and master thesis (Natural Science PhDs ONLY)</u>
- Language Certificate/Requirement
  - <u>Students:</u> Language certificate (for German or English)
  - <u>Post-Doc and Staff:</u> Minimum language requirement: Level B2 or higher according to the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages
- <u>Letter of Invitation</u> (PhD/doctorate, post-doc and staff ONLY) demonstrating the host university's interest in hosting the scholar please contact the relevant department/unit to find out if it can host you on the basis of your research/work plan.
- Passport copy
- <u>Curriculum Vitae</u>

#### **Translations of documents**

If original documents (certificates, transcripts, etc) are not in English or German, they must be accompanied by an official translation into either English or German. Selected degree students will have to provide certified translations into German during the application process at the University of Graz.

#### Next steps after selection via the AL IDRISI II consortium

The University of Graz requires selected students to complete the University of Graz application procedure, before visa and acceptance letters can be sent!

• <u>Exchange students</u> must complete the online application via the University of Graz online tool. A print-off of the "Application Form" signed by the student and the "Study Confirmation" signed by the advisor at the home university along with all relevant academic documentation must then be sent via surface mail to the contact person in Graz.

All students selected for University of Graz will be contacted by the Graz contact person upon the official confirmation of their selection by the coordinating university and advised in detail.
